



## **Service Honours and Colours**

### **Service Honours**

School Honours are the highest accolade awarded to a student in the Colours/Honours system. Awarding of Honours rewards outstanding significant achievement in the fields of either Academic, Cultural, Service or Sport.

### **Criteria**

Years 11-12 students who achieved FULL COLOURS in Service and partaking in external voluntary service over an extended period of time can become eligible for Honours. Students are required to accumulate service over a 3–6-year period and nominally undertake 100 logged hours involvement.



## Service Full Colours

### Criteria

1. Achieve 11+ points recognising contribution to the service life of the College, one of which (community service, actively involved in House charities and service or involvement with an external community group) should be completed by either Year 11 or 12.
2. Use the points system below:

Category	Points	Activity/Performance
<b>Achievement, Service and Leadership in Service</b>	<b>11</b>	<p>50 hours and above</p> <p>Students will have completed at least 50 logged community service hours across at least two types of service over three consecutive year. While completing these activities, leadership and initiative will have been demonstrated in one of the following areas in either Year 11 or 12.</p> <p>Community Service completed through Co-curricular activities, CAS or other College events</p> <p><b>OR</b></p> <p>Initiate and run House charities and service</p> <p><b>OR</b></p> <p>Involvement with an external community group</p>



## Service Half Colours

### Criteria

1. Students must achieve 10+ points recognising contribution to the service life of the College to be awarded in Years 10, 11 or 12.
2. Use the points system below:

<b>Achievement, Service and Leadership in Service</b>	<b>10</b>	<p>40 hours</p> <p>Students will have completed at least 30 logged community service hours across at least three areas over three years, while supporting the activities, demonstrating leadership and initiative in one of the areas in either Year 10 to 12.</p> <p>Community Service completed through co-curricular activities, CAS or Cultural events  <b>AND/OR</b></p> <p>Actively involved in House charities and service  <b>AND/OR</b></p> <p>Involvement with an external community group</p>
	<b>6</b>	<p>30 hours</p> <p>Students will have completed at least 30 logged community connect hours across at least two areas over three years, while supporting the activities in one of the areas in Years 10 to 12.</p> <p>Community service completed through co-curricular activities CAS or Cultural events  <b>AND/OR</b></p> <p>Actively involved in House charities and service to the House  <b>AND/OR</b></p> <p>Demonstrated leadership and initiative in one of the areas            (Only 12 hours can be accumulated in one area over one year)</p>
	<b>4</b>	<p>20 hours</p> <p>Students will have completed at least 20 logged community connect hours across at least two areas over three years,</p>

<b>Service Bonus Points</b>	<b>5</b>	Participated in a service tour such as Transform Cambodia

	<b>1</b>	Assisted at College Open Evenings
