

Child Safe Framework

The following Child Safe Framework has been endorsed by the College Board of the Lake Joondalup Baptist College. This Framework has been designed with guidance from AISWA and is based on the Australian Human Rights Commission, National Principles for Child Safe Organisations, The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, Creating Child Safe Institutions and also resources from the Commissioner for Children and Young People, Child Safe Organisations WA.

Although these resources form the foundation for the Child Safe Framework, it is important to note that the Lake Joondalup Baptist College Child Safe Framework reflects the College's specific child safe practices and processes.

The College Management Team have examined each area and has identified programs offered at the College which can be incorporated into each specific domain.




Leadership Governance and Culture
